## What's New?

# Capital Grant 2024 for Expansion of funded childcare support for the under threes.

North East Lincolnshire Council has been allocated some Capital funding to support the development of new places. There is no revenue funding available to support any new places.

Across North East Lincolnshire there are almost 8,000 part time (15hours) funded places available for children from 9months to school age. When all the data above has been assessed and analysed the current projections show that there are sufficient places within NEL in the academic year 2023-24 and 2024-25. However not all of these are in the right place or age range.

Once the new expanded entitlement for the under-three's increases to 30 hours in September 2025, we will require additional places to be developed to meet the projected demand. Current data projects that we may need almost 400 PTE places for under 2's in the borough by summer 2026. Although the data shows we have enough places within the borough before this, the places are not always in the right place or age range.

The latest information suggests that East Marsh, Immingham, Park, Sidney Sussex, South and Waltham wards have a surplus of places across all age ranges. Of the other nine wards, one has a lack of places in all age ranges and the other eight have deficits in one or more age range. It is possible that some of those surplus places could be converted to a different age range i.e. Change places from 3 and 4 year olds to 2 year olds.

## **Frequently Asked Questions**

## Q: How can I apply for Capital funding?

**A:** All interested parties who wish to claim Capital funding are asked to complete the expression of interest form in the first instance. These will be assessed to ensure the proposals are to support new places, in an area of need and value for money. Successful expressions of interest will be asked to submit a fully costed application.

## Q: What can the funding be used for?

**A:** Capital expenditure is defined as expenditure incurred on the acquisition of a tangible, productive asset, whose minimum value exceeds £2,500 (including VAT) and which will give continuous service for more than 12 months. The asset purchased is expected to provide service beyond the financial year in which it was acquired.

Capital expenditure is not necessarily restricted to single purchases costing more than £2,500. The following categories of expenditure are deemed as capital:

- Individual assets: This is the expenditure incurred on a single item with a value which exceeds £2,500, including VAT.
- Grouped assets: This is the expenditure on assets of a similar nature purchased or ordered at the same time as part of a project. Example include, a children's play area, or a playroom in a childcare setting. This can also include consultancy costs or project management costs incurred as part of delivering the project. In this instance, the value of the individual assets may in isolation fall below the capital expenditure threshold but the total value of all the grouped items must exceed £2,500 before they can be classified as capital expenditure.

## Q: Can I apply to take more 3 and 4 year olds?

**A:** No the grant is specifically to support the expansion of funded places for the under three's.

# Q: If I convert some of my 3 & 4 year places to places for under threes, are these classed as new places?

**A:** Yes, if you change your existing places to a different age range, they are classed as new as they were not available before the change.

Example: 36 places = 24 for 3 & 4's and 12 for 2's changed to 16 for 3 4's and 20 for 2's creates 8 new 2 year places

You will need to ensure that you have the space and the staff to accommodate the younger age range. The space and staffing ratios are different in the EYFS for the under threes. You are also advised to notify Ofsted or Childminder agency of any changes too (PVI's/CM's)

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# Nutrition content for early years providers - Help for Early Years Providers

The Department for Education in collaboration with the London Early Years
Foundation (LEYF) and Anaphylaxis UK have developed new nutrition content on the Help for Early Years providers platform.

Within the Early Years Foundation Stage framework there is a requirement that states: 'Where children are provided with meals, snacks, and drinks, these must be healthy, balanced and nutritious.'

Establishing healthy eating habits at a young age is important for long-term health. As early years practitioners you can help set solid foundations for children's future health by providing them with nutritious food in your settings.

Help for Early Years Providers has added <u>new nutrition content</u> including videos to help you fulfil the requirement to provide healthy, balanced and nutritious food for the children in your care.

### The content:

- explains the importance of introducing good food habits from birth
- includes information on the dietary requirements of babies and young children and how to plan a balanced menu
- provides recipe cards for tasty, cost effective, nutritious recipes you can use in your settings
- gives tips on how to introduce solid foods safely to babies
- provides information on food safety
- links to further reading and resources

## **Changes to the Early Years Qualifications List (EYQL)**

A new post-September 2024 tab has been added to the <u>Early Years Qualifications List</u> (<u>EYQL</u>), following the publication of the new <u>Level 3 Early Years Educator (EYE)</u> <u>criteria</u>, which is effective from September 2024. <u>No qualifications have been removed.</u>

The "Guidance" tab of the EYQL has also be updated with information on what the new tab means. In summary, to count as a full & relevant (F&R) qualification, enabling the holder to count within staff:child ratios at level 3 in early years settings in England:

- Qualifications started **on or after 1 September 2024 and before 1 September 2025** must be listed on either the post-Sept 2014 tab or the post-Sept 2024 tab.
- Qualifications started on or after 1 September 2025 must be listed on the post-Sept 2024 tab.

## **Consultation/Survey's**

## **Early Years Foundation Stage consultations launched**

On 22 April the Department for Education launched a consultation on safeguarding requirements within the Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) framework.

The proposals in the consultation aim to ensure the safeguarding requirements are as comprehensive as possible for providers and are suitably robust to keep children safe.

The consultation proposals include:

- Amendments to promote safer recruitment including new requirements to obtain references and requiring safeguarding policies to include procedures to follow to help ensure recruitment of suitable individuals.
- Creation of new requirements for following up if a child is absent for a prolonged period of time and amendments to ensure providers hold additional emergency contact details.
- Creation of new requirements to ensure safer eating.
- Creation of a safeguarding training criteria annex and a requirement for safeguarding policies to include details of how safeguarding training is delivered and how practitioners are supported to put it into place.
- Amendments to clarify that early years students and trainees are required to have paediatric first aid (PFA) training.
- Amendments to ensure that children's privacy when changing nappies and toileting is considered and balanced with safeguarding need.
- A small number of other minor changes to the structure and wording of the safeguarding requirements to improve clarity.

What will you learn on the Sarleguarding Children module?
Students will be introduced to the protocots involved in safeguarding children and will
be made aware of their individual responsibilities within this arena. The aims of the module are that
students develop a very clear understanding of the historical aspects of safeguarding and how and
why it has shaped and developed in the way that is. There have been many important factors that
have impacted upon the safeguarding remit and the factors that impact upon the decisions made
and the strategies underaken to keep children safe. The module will explore a number of
consemporary issues that relate to the safeguarding realm, including a focus on safeguarding child in
the digital work. This will align with seaturory requirements in relation to keeping children safe from
harm and in recognising the signs and symptoms of abuse.

- completion of this module, you will be able to: lidentify and listics the skills required with others to safeguard. Evaluate and discuss legislation and policies by identifying key elements. Evaluate definitions of child ables and the safeguarding of children in different historical scenarios. Apply safeguarding theory to everyday practice in the Early Years Sector.

What will you learn on the Young Children's Learning and Development module?

The aim of this module is to ensure students gain an understanding of the main body of theories associated within child development. This includes exploring different physical disabilities and learning difficulties, brain development and the effects of trauma on learning. The students will have opportunities to consider different ways in which learning takes place and ectors that may influence development and learning. This module will help students to explore various issues concerning children and their growth from different perspectus Caliring an understanding of physical, emotional, cognitive and social development is one of the most important aspects of working with young children and in supporting families, it is the role of the practitioner to ensure that these development needs are being met and that as a sector the children and their families are being

# CHILDCARE APPLICATIONS FOR PARENTS OF 9 MONTH OLDS TO OPEN 12 MAY

Applications for the second phase of the largest ever expansion of free childcare in England's history will open on 12 May, the government has announced.

From that date, eligible working parents of children from 9 months old will be able to register to access 15 hours of government-funded childcare a week, with the offer beginning from September 2024.
